

Forest Fires and Game

Forest fires sweep across the nesting grounds of grouse and other game birds, destroying eggs and young birds. Fires destroy the forage upon which big game animals live. When fires occur late in the hearing in Portland the following fall big game animals, especially deer, suffer during the following winter and frequently die of starvation.
