Good Cooking Indicates Imagination

If you are not a good cook—you lack imagination. At least this is the theory advanced by a famous Parisian chef, who maintains that the difference between a good cook and a mediocre one is a difference in imagination. At any rate this statement would seem to hold good in the case of the woman who believes that inasmuch as canned foods are cooked foods, all she has to do is to heat and serve them.

It is true you can heat and serve canned foods. They are healthful and palatable as they come from the cans, but just as you use sauces, seasoning and gravies to make changes in the character of "fresh" foods, so you must do with canned foods.

Suppose, for example, that you have only a half a minute to prepare a tomato soup. It takes only that long to add the prescribed can of water and heat. But suppose your time is more carefully planned, and you have, say, ten minutes to give to the soup course, which the Parisian chef says is the all-important course in the dinner. You open a can of tomato soup, add a teaspoon of butter, a bit of onion juice, a dash of paprika, grated cheese and a sprig of parsley to float on top. Your soup has been trans-

formed from plain tomato soup to an exquisite culinary creation. Celery soup from the can may be flavored and topped by a snowy drift of whipped cream, or heavy cream not whipped but simply floated over it. This is a very good way to introduce a dinner.

Just as it is possible to add individual flavoring and seasoning to soup, so it is with many foods which come in cans. The canner puts the best possible ingredients into his product and in a sanitary and scientific manner which the woman at home could not possibly do. He has done all the heavy work for you and you are free to devote your energies and your creative talents to producing an artistic and epicurean dish from the food you remove from the can.

Not everyone likes spaghetti in the real Italian style, so the grocer keeps on his shelves plain canned spaghetti as well as Italian spaghetti to which the housewife may add what seasoning she pleases. The woman with imagination can create from this perfect foundation, an Italian dish that would rival the product of Venetian kitchens, if she will sear some chopped meat in olive oil in which finely chopped onions are yellowing, and

adding to it a can of mushrooms, then serving with a dish of heaped Parmesan cheese and bread sticks.

Canned boneless chicken is one of the foods that can be made into excellent dishes by combining with other foods. If one wishes to make one's own Chicken a la King, it is only necessary to add to the contents of one can of boneless chicken, a medium size can of mushrooms, salt and pepper to taste; then place on triangles of golden brown toast, pour over a creamy sauce, garnish with parsley and lay over the top strips of red pimento.

Chili con carni, as it comes from the can is a very authentic Mexican dish—frijole beans included. But if one has the Mexican taste to the extent of craving highly seasoned foods, add a few red peppers, a little more finely chopped onion, and this is a dish you will remember.

Fruits come to us in cans, of course, as a perfect dish. A can of Hawaiian pineapple holds the most perfect fruit which Hawaii produces, sun-ripened in the fields. But if we want our fruits blended with the nicety that pleases our particular palate, we can combine this can of pineapple, say, with a can of prunes or figs and we have a satisfying and healthful dish.
