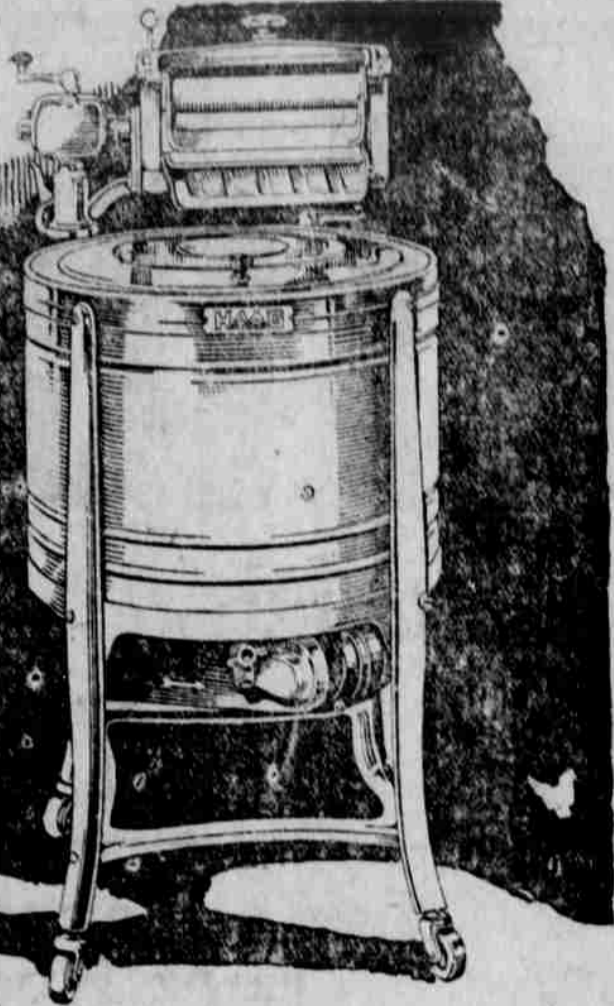

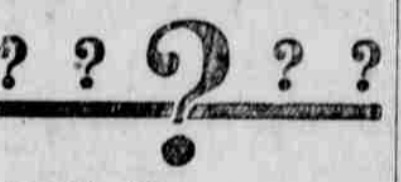
Baker—Old Badger mine to be unwatered to 400-foot level, and operated.
