ABOUT FAIR GROUNDS

There is still some agitation around The Dalles regarding a fair grounds. The proposition to make a fair grounds from the tract owned by the county and now used as a county farm, was laid on the shelf at the recent election. Some people at the county seat want a county fair grounds, but do not know how to proceed to get one. We'll tell them how.

The Southern Wasco County Fair association owns a fine piece of ground in Tygh Valley. That ground is equipped with exhibition buildings has good tables, a grand stand, fine dance floor, stables for racing stock, one of the best half mile tracks in the state, and is supplied with running spring water. Those grounds are owned by stockholders, each of whom strives to build up and make stronger each succeeding fair.

Those grounds may be purchased. We have not learned of an individual stockholder who is not willing to sell his stock to the county. But none are anxious to let go. If The Dalles people want a county fair it is possible the stockholders and directors of the Tygh Valley association would be willing to lease the grounds to the county, the county to assume full management and charge of exhibitions, paying a nominal rental for the grounds. Or, if preferable, the county could buy off the stockholders, pay up the small indebtedness against the property, and conduct fair according to their own ideas.

There is no place near The Dalles where a fair grounds could be made without great expense. Here the grounds are ready for any exhibition; they lie in an ideal location, easily accessible, lying in the heart of the producing section of the county, and has an established reputation as being one of the best grounds in the state, and whose exhibitions have attained a status with the best. If those Dalles people are in earnest about wanting a fair grounds, here is their chance. Either ride or get off the horse.

The Oregon State Motor association is sending out matter for publication containing much advice to motorists. In none of their literature to reach this office is the motorist advised to watch the road and not attempt to light cigarettes and try to steer the car at the same time. The accident on the highway lately was caused by just that action.

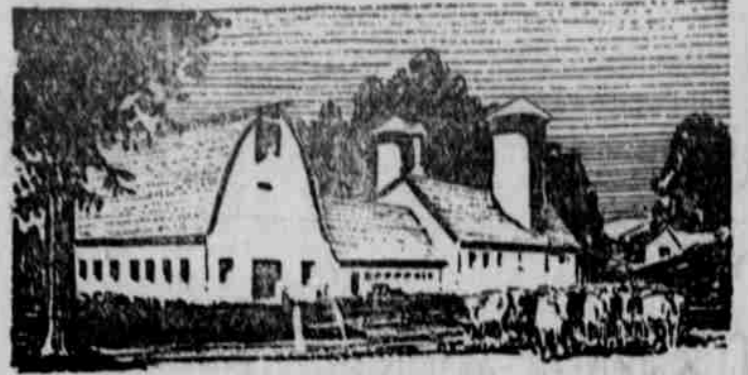

THE way to greater prosperity on the farm is being pointed out by the activities of Cow Improvement and Testing Associations all over the country. Efforts have been directed, particularly, towards improvements in both herds and sires.

Remarkable successes have been recorded, the most recent coming from a progressive mid-western Association. One of the herd sires in the association has 15 daughters (in 6 different herds) averaging 471 pounds of butter fat each. A son of the sire has 5 daughters (3 yearlings and 2 two-year-olds) whose average production is 41 pounds of fat per month.
