"INSIDE" INFORMATION

Chocolate that appears white on the outside has been kept in an overwarm place, so that some of the fat has melted and come to the surface. It is not injured in any way for use.

There is no reson why fresh or properly preserved fish should not be eaten at the same meal as milk. Fish and milk are often cooked together in the form of milk chowders or creamed dishes.

Work butter for sandwiches to a cream but do not melt it. Cut the bread into thin even slices. If you are going to trim off the crusts, put no butter too near them. Bread for sandwiches is best when about 24 hours old.

Always iron with the thread of the goods, and iron until the garment is dry. Otherwise it will pucker. Shiny gloss on the hems, tucks or seams, can be removed by moistening a piece of cheesecloth with clear water, wringing it dry. and wiping it quickly over the shiny surface.

Dandeline greens can be gathered very early in the season, when they are yong, tender, and least bitter. it is a good plan to combine the etables or flavors which modify it.






