Most of the broomcorn used in American manufacture of various styles and sizes of brooms is grown in and around the western half of Oklahoma. Broomcorn is one of the latest crops to be planted for harvest in the same year. In Oklahoma best results are obtained with plantings from about June 15 to July 1.
