Though it may discouraging to know that there are forty or more insect pests that may attack your stored grain, it is consoling to learn that any of them can be controlled by carbon disulphide. This materal, although highly inflammable, is particularly adapted as a fumigant in the small elevator or the average grain bin or crib on the farm where the fire bazard can be controlled.

Many ills to which calves are subject can be traced to unsuitable stables, according to the U. S. Department of Agriculture. Calves kept in stables that are clean, dry, light, sunny, warm, well ventilated. and free from draughts are less suseptible to pneumonia, from which many die in winter. Digestive ailments also are less likely to develop if the bedding, stalls, and feed roughs are kept clean.


