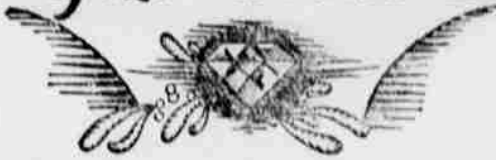
Herb Lewis removed a large snag that was blocking the highway near Pole hill, on Tue day. He is again dragging the road.
