Small, hard grains like rye, wheat, barley and kafir should always be ground or rolled before being fed to livestock.

Cattle that have been fattened should be given only dry, non-laxative feeds for 3 or 4 days before shipping. This enables them to reach the market in better condition.

Rabbits need mineral salt in some form, preferably in spool that can be fastened to the side of the hutch. Salt spools can be bought at a rabbit of poultry supply house.

The instincts in a horse that are opposed to obedience to man increase in strength with age, so it is very desirable to begin the education of the colt as early as possible. A good plan is to break colts to lead before they are weaned, and to harness them between the ages of 2 and 3 years. Accustom colts to work gradually and do not use them at heavy work until they are practically mature.

Many markets made a deduction in weight or in price for live poultry that is "overcropped." It is advisable not to put any feed in the coops when shipping poultry to market. It the birds will not arrive at the market for 24 hours or more,

one of two tin cans filled with corn well soaked in water may be nailed in each coop. The water in the corn helps to satisfy the birds' thirst, and the corn helps to cut down shrinkage in weight but does not make the crops too full.

Grass stains will usually come out of washable materials with vigorous rubbing, hot water and soap, if treated while fresh. If traces of stain remain on white materials, they may be bleached out with Javelle water.

It is a mistake to try to save ice by wrapping it in papers or cloth. You want to save food, which is done by lowering the refrigerator temperature through the warm air coming into contact with the ice. This naturally melts the ice, but at the time accomplishes the purpose of refrigeration.
