That familiarity breeds contempt of danger is shown by an article printed in the Pittsburg Leader. "See that?" asked an engineer of the East River bridge, pointing to a small ladder set into one of the steel piers at an elevation of more than two hundred feet above the street. So closely did the ladder cling to the smooth surface of the steel that it seemed almost impossible to get the fingers between the rungs and the pier.

"Those steps were intended to be used only under the most pressing cir-cumstances," continued the engineer, "and then only with great care. 


