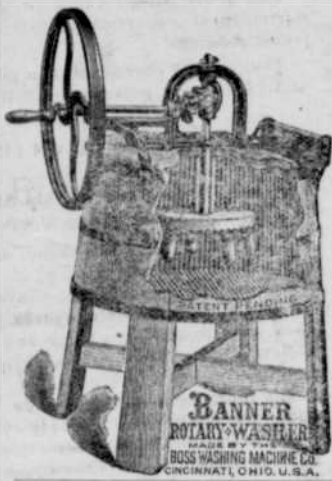


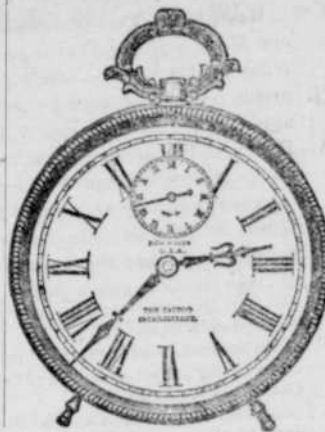

## FARMERS' INSTITUTE. The Estacada Brick and Tile Company.

Next Thursday, December 22, a farmers' institute will convene in Estacada. There will be three sessions, forenoon beginning at 10 a. m. one in the afternoon and one in the evening. If the program is not finished efforts will be made to have the meeting continued another day. The institute will be held under the auspices of the Oregon Agricultural college. Subjects relating to agriculture, horticulture, dairying and the home will be presented. Stereopticon illustrated lectures will be a feature of the evening session. This company was formed Sept. 3, 1904, for the purpose of manufacturing brick, tile, pottery ware and all articles which can be made from clay and kindred substances, and for other necessary purposes. The incorporators are, G. W. Morrow, William T. Muir, A. F. Campbell, R. L. Durham, J. M. Nickum, A. C. Mowrey and W. H. Hurlburt. The capital stock is \$75,000 which is divided into 750 shares of \$100 each. The principal office is at 134 First street, Portland, Ore., and the factory is to be in Estacada, Ore. and occupy a site 8 acres in extent. The company already owns 40 acres of clay-bearing land which cost \$200 per acre. The estimated cost of the factory is \$40,000 which will include a 100 horse-power engine and a 125 horse-power boiler. The clays are of several colors, red, white, blue, black and yellow, but all are of practically similar chemical composition. Exhaustive expert analyses of the clay show that it is of a very high grade, and the quantity is practically inexhaustible. Brick that have been made from the samples taken from the clay-beds are the best made. The location of this factory in Estacada will go a long way towards making this a town. Portland has been using 40,000,000 brick annually, and this amount will soon be doubled, hence
