Our Scenery

The NEWS has never spoken of the natural scenery of this part of Clackamas county. But beautiful scenery abounds here nevertheless. The Clackamas river on the banks of which Estacada stands is a turbulent stream with high, irregular, rocky banks. There are many beautiful rapids and castle rocks that compare very favorably with those the pictures of which are used for advertising purposes by the great railway companies. Many picturesque falls are to be seen along the banks. Springwater falls on the south bank of the river at the lower end of the park are more beautiful to look at than the world renowned Minnehaha falls. From the upper part of town can be seen Mt. St. Helens and from the heights above the town all the other high snow-capped peaks may be seen. Springs are many furnishing the purest of water for those who want it. The twin falls, Pochontas and Sacawajea, one on each side of the high bridge, always excite admiration from those who see them.
