So Says London Writer, Comparing It
Comparison of the British
Comparison of the British and the American consular service is made in recent number of the London CbamNew York Times. "Comparisons have frequently been drawn," this articlo says, "between our consuls and those of the United States of America, to the effect that the latter do much more to promote American commerce than the former do for the trade of the em-
pire. This is undoubtedly the case owing to the reasons we will endeavor to set out.
"The American consul has at his command far greater facllities for gauging the trade and commerce actually transacted at the place to which he is appointed than his British colleague possesses under the existing conditions of the two services. He reably expect from the Department of ably expect from the Department of tistical matter relating to the general tistical matter relating to the general trade of the Unired, the sdvance sheets of the re ports of his colleagues on particular subjects.

On the other hand, a British consul is, we belleve, officially supplled only with the Board of Trade Journal and coples of consular and diplomatie reports on trade and commerce, which moreover, are not sent as soon as pubhished, but in bundles once or twice year.
