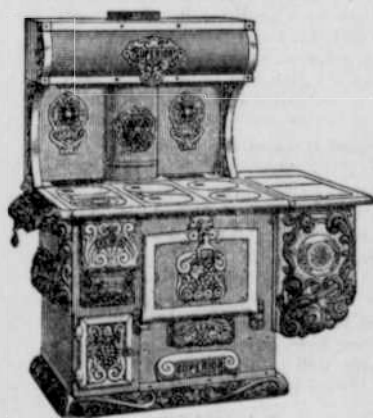

Woman's Life

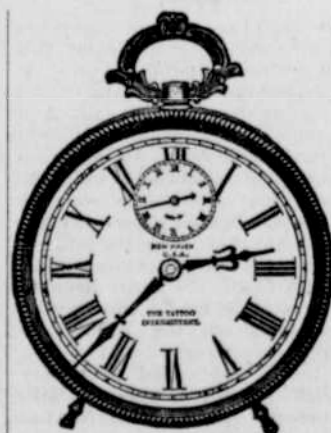
