Bank to Begin Business June 1.

The first floor will be divided into offices for the bank and law department. A large, brick safety vault will be installed.

More Machinery Put In

This week the Estacada Wood Mfg. Co. set up its new twentyone hole boring machine. It was bought of a Chattanooga, Tenn., foundry and it is the largest boring machine ever made by the firm. The new machine is used to bore holes in telephone and telegraph cross-arms. Another piece of machinery, a shaper, was damaged in a railroad accident and had to be sent to a Portland foundry for repairs. The dryer which holds 80,000 feet of lumber is in use drying material for future work.
