Estacada is going to have another new business firm. The Estacada Banking Company has been formed. A. E. Barr has sold his interest in the store business to the firm which will assume the business after June first. The new company has purchased the store property and the drug store property on the corner; however, the present occupants of the drug store have it leased until next March, after that it will be converted into a bank building. Articles of incorporation have been filed with James Johns, president; W. S. Henninger, secretary & cashier, and J. W. Reed, vice president. The capital stock is \$25,000. divided into 250 shares of \$100 each. The company will do a general banking business, and will open up the first of June. Messrs. Henninger and Johns are from North Dakota. Mr. Reed is mayor of Estacada and is extensively interested here. It is said the new firm will operate a big department store.

May be paid at the office of the Clackamas Title Company, 608 Chamber of Commerce Bldg. in Portland, where a copy of the Tax Roll is kept.
