Notice of Removal of the United States Land Office From Oregon City, Oregon, to Portland, Oregon

Notice is hereby given that the President of the United States, by Executive order dated March 21, 1905, has, pursuant to section 2251 of the Revised Statutes of the United States, and by virtue of the authority therein given, directed that the United States land office now located at Oregon City, Oregon, be removed, with its business, records, and archives, to Portland, Oregon.

In pursuance of said Executive order, the United States land office of Oregon City, Oregon, will be permanently closed and discontinued at the close of business hours on June 30, 1905, and its business, records, and archives removed to Portland, Oregon, on July 1, 1905.
