W. H. Shankland, An Old Pioneer, Passes Away.

W. H. Shankland, who died on his farm near here at 12:20 p. m., June 8, was born in Nicholas Co. Ky. March 8, 1834. He migrated in 1853 to Ill. with the family and in '60 married Nancy Linn and came to Oregon in 1869, crossing the plains. He settled in Clackamas county and occupied the old home, one mile north of Estacada, continuously until his death, except three years spent in Catlin, Wash. Mr. Shankland was postmaster at Zion postoffice for two years. The funeral took place at 11 o'clock last Saturday, and was conducted by Rev. Creige, of Portland, and the remains were laid to rest in the cemetery on the Wade farm. Deceased leaves a wife and four children—Effie, Theodore, Elmer and Andrew Shankland. Mr. Shankland had been ill for several months. He was a good neighbor, and much thought of by all his friends and acquaintances who regret his departure. He was a member of the Methodist church.
