

# ESTACADA, OREGON

The new terminal city of the Oregon Water Power and Railway Company's standard gauge electric railroad, is 36 miles Southeast of Portland on the Clackamas river. A rich farming, fruit-raising and stock raising country surrounds the place. Any amount of the best of timber abounds which is converted into lumber by numerous sawmills and sold at reasonable prices. The railroad facilities are the best, see time table elsewhere. Estacada is situated to become a manufacturing center, the river will supply any amount of power. The railway company is now constructing a 15,000 horse power electric plant one and a half mile above here. A large woodworking factory is in operation. Here is a good field for a furniture factory, an implement and handle factory, wagon and carriage factory, box and basket factory, shoe factory, and other industries. A fruit cannery would pay well. At the annual school meeting, held Monday, 23 voters were present. The school board was present and the proceedings of the previous meetings were read, also the clerk's report. The district has 96 persons of school age, and 44 of these did not attend school the past year. The number of legal voters in the district was placed at 90. The district has received since its organization \$217.31 and has expended \$243.95 leaving an indebtedness of \$26.94. The school property, including grounds, building and furniture was estimated to be valued at \$1,400. The new board of directors as elected is composed of J. A. Reed chairman for a term of one year; John Stormer for a term of two yrs, and R. A. Stratton for a term of three years. John Lovelace was nominated for a second term as clerk and with a view of expediting matters the News editor permitted his own name to be used also, with his election as a result. After the regular meeting the new board met and was sworn in.

#### SHAM BATTLE AT FAIR

What promises to be the most realistic sham battle in the annal of mimic warfare will take place of the Lewis and Clark Exposition July 21 constituting the crowning feature of three days of military maneuvers in which at least 1,500 troops will take part. The battle will be made realistic by the shooting of cannon and small arms loaded with blank cartridges, and is expected to prove one of the most popular of the many features which have been arranged to make every day until the close of Exposition, Oct. 15, a special day. Adjutant-Gen. Finzer, in conference with President Goode of the Exposition has arranged the more important details. During the first two days of the encampment at the Exposition there will be a dress parade and a grand review in honor of Governor Chamberlain and staff. A number of competitive drills will be held. The battle proper will be between two detachments, one wearing the brown khaki uniform and the other the blue. The browns will entrench themselves on the hillside directly west of the Exposition and await the approach of the attacking party of blues. The field artillery will supplement the entrenched force while the cavalry will assist the attacking party, operating from the rear or flank.
