**3,000 CELEBRATE**

**Estacada Entertains a Large  
Crowd July 4.**

Thousands flocked to Estacada to spend the glorious Fourth, and many hundred more could not get out here on account of inadequate car service. The trains were delayed by a few cars getting off the track. The day was an ideal one, and hundreds of people from the country came in to take part in the day's doings. Few went to Portland. Senator George C. Brownell delivered an eloquent and patriotic speech which was listened to by several hundred people, and although it was not advertised as a real 4th of July celebration, everything went off as planned, and everyone had a fine time for which the management should feel proud. Not a disturbance occurred to mar the day's pleasure, and the city marshal and his assistants had an easy time. The amount of popular subscription for the day was \$48.50 and the day's expense was \$47 leaving a balance of \$1.50 which will go to a fund for a grand racing tourna to be held here in the fall.

**Another Old Pioneer Passes to  
the Great Beyond**

The death of Mr. Carrol Howell took place Sunday morning July 2, at his old home across the river at Estacada. Mr. Howell was passing from the house to the barn when a sudden attack of heart disease took him and he fell over and expired. The disease had troubled him for some time. He came across the big plains in 1861, and was 68 years of age, and was a respected and well-liked citizen. Mr. Howell was born in Washington county, Arkansas, and leaves a wife, three daughters and seven sons. The funeral took place at the Springwater church and the remains interred in the cemetery close by, Rev. Stubbs preaching.
