The ordinances which have been passed by the city council are:

Nos. 1 and 2 are ordinances regulating the sale of spirituous, vinous and malt liquors.

No. 3 places the city treasurer's bond at \$2,000

No. 4 places the city recorder's bond at \$2,000

No. 5 places the city marshal's bond at \$1,000

No. 6 is an ordinance establishing a fixed rules of order and business for the council.

No. 7 is an ordinance providing for protection of city officers while performing their duty.

No. 8 makes it unlawful for minors to be on the streets after certain hours, 8 p. m. in Nov. Dec. Jan. Feb. and March.

No. 9, an ordinance forbidding the use or explosion of fireworks and firearms within the city.

No. 10 regulates the conduct of certain stock business.

No. 11 is an ordinance to license and regulate the carrying on of certain professions, trades, occupations and callings within the city.

No. 12 is an ordinance which provides for the suppression and prohibition of gaming with cards, games of chance and gambling rooms.

No. 13 establishes and fixes the boundry of sewer district 1.

No. 14 regulates the registry and taxing of dogs.

COUNTY PROMISES \$6,000

An order has been made by the Clackamas County Court by which 70 percent of the cost of building a bridge across the Clackamas at Barton is assumed by the county. \$6,000 is to be the most the county is to appropriate for the improvement.

The building of the bridge together with connecting grades on each side it is estimated will cost at least \$16,000. The petitioners have raised \$6,000 outside of the county appropriation in subscriptions and a half of this was given by the O W P & Ry. Co.

There is yet \$4,000 to be raised before the improvement will be an assured undertaking.
