The Estacada Brick and Tile Factory

Work on the Plant Has Begun and Will Be Hurried to Completion.

The Estacada Brick and Tile Co. has its factory well under course of construction, and it will not be long before the company will be manufacturing and shipping the finest quality of pressed brick. Vice-President and General manager E. C. Belknap is overseeing the work. He has a crew of men at work at the clay beds getting the material ready to be sent to the factory. A railroad will be built from the beds to the factory via Shafford, Ninth and Wade streets for the transportation of clay. The main building which J. W. Reed has the contract for building and which will contain the machinery is 34x56. A drying shed 50x100 is also building, and additions to these will be made later. The machinery for the plant has been purchased of Chisholm, Boyd & White of Chicago, and is considered the best there is for making a high grade of pressed brick. The power will be supplied by an Atlas engine and boiler. A sidetrack from the railroad will be constructed over to the factory. The work that has already been done at the clay beds reveals an inexhaustible quantity of clay from which can be made pressed brick of all colors, also sewer pipe, tile and drain pipe, terra cotta, and pottery of various articles. The location of the plant is an ideal one. Charles Smith of the Chisholm, Boyd & White Company of Chicago is superintending the construction of the plant, and he will have charge of the factory hands when in operation. Manager Belknap will have charge of the sales department.
