ORDINANCE 15

An ordinance providing for the laying and building of sidewalks on certain streets in the city of Estacada, Oregon. Passed July 19, 1905. Approved July 19, 1905

TACADA:

Section 1. The Common Council of the City of Estacada hereby authorizes and directs the building and maintaining | cada as directed by charter of said city. of sidewalks on the following unimproved streets of the said city, to-wit:

East and West sides of Broadway between Second and Third streets and in front of lots on the West and East sides of Main E. C. HUNT, Estacada, Oregon street from Second to Third street, said sidewalks to be of the uniform width of ten feet of good quality of two inch fir plank dressed on one side and two edges plank to be not less than six inches nor more than ten inches in width, to be laid on four parallel stringers, size two inches by six inches, on edge, and well spiked down, said sidewalks are to be built to grades established by order of the council with a fall of one-fourth inch to the foot from the inner edge of walk toward the center of the street.

Section 2. Sidewalks of the width of six feet of the same quality of two inch fir plank laid on three parallel stringers as herein above in front of lots on the West side of Broadway from Third street to Seventh street, and on the East side of Main street from Third street to Sixth street, and on the East side of Zobrist street from Second to Third street and on the West side of said street from Third street to Fourth street, and on the North side of Second street from Zobrist street to the Boulevard, and on the South side of Second street from Broadway to Main street and on the West side of Main street from Second street to the railroad platform abutting the hotel block, and on the South side of Third street from Zobrist street to Main street.


