The Barton Bridge

Plans and specifications of the new bridge over the Clackamas river at Barton have been completed and the county court will ask for bids. The county offers to pay 70 per cent of the whole cost of construction, providing the cost to the county does not exceed \$6000. It is figured that the total cost of the bridge and road approaches will be in the neighborhood of \$12,000 and if the bridge is built, all amounts in excess of \$6,000 must be guaranteed by private individuals.
