#### CLEANLY SHAVING STICK. Arrangement Which Presents

Conveniences. Shaving sticks, as at present manufactured, are cylindrical in shape and are sold in cylindrical casing of cardboard or other suitable material. In using the stick it is commonly re-moved from the case and after use re-placed therein. The objection to this form is that the fingers are gummed with the soap and when the soap is replaced in the box, it is apt to be sticky, and, therefore, before used again becomes fastened to the casing. When the stick is not removed from the casing it eventually wears down to a point where a readjustment is neces-

sary, and this usually is only accomplished by the destruction of the shape of the stick. A Philadelphia inventor

proposes to overcome these objections by providing a ring made of metal, cr other suitable material, that has an edge adapted to bite into the soap while its outer edge clamps the inner side of the casing holding the stick therein By this construction the fin. By the stick is construction the stick therein. By this construction the fingers are neither made sticky nor does the soap become fastened to the inside of the casing. The metal clamping ring is made with a break in the outer edge, this constituting a spring clamp. The inside of the ring is provided with teeth adapted to engage in the soap stick, holding it securely. It will be understood, as the soap stick is worn off by use, the clamping ring must be moved toward its unused end. The ring not only affords a convenient grasp, but prevents the moisture from getting inside the casing. An arrangement similar to the ordinary spring controlled candle lamp, but modified to adapt it for the broad surface of the soap stick top, might also be worked


### Important Officials.




