Barton Bridge Bids

Running high to the extent of several thousand dollars over the estimates made by the petitioners for the construction of a bridge across the Clackamas river at Barton, the bids were opened by the county court Friday afternoon. The lowest bid was that of the Portland Bridge and Building Co., which was \$12,500. All of the other bids were rejected, but the contract was not awarded, as the county court wishes to determine if the petitioners are willing to subscribe \$6500 toward the construction of the bridge. The petitioners made an offer to the court to aid the county to the extent of paying any sum over \$6000, and this amount the county court agree to appropriate. But the excess \$6500 is beyond the figures of the petitioners and it is not known whether they can raise the extra amount. The matter was laid over until Thursday, September 14. The bids were:

Payn, Connell and Thomas, \$14,275; Puget Sound Bridge and Dredging Co., \$13,980; The International Construction Co., \$13,396; Burrell Construction Co., \$13,320; C. F. Royal & son, \$12,700; Portland Bridge and Building Co., \$12,500.

Ordinance 20, regulating the construction of flues, entrances to public buildings and for the prevention of fires; and ordinance 21, defining nuisances and providing for their abatement were passed by the council Tuesday. No definite action was taken on the water system question. It was discussed pro and con and will perhaps be disposed of after the sewer proposition is thoroughly disposed of.
