Dam and the Salmon

"Operations with spring salmon on the Clackamas have practically resulted in failure," said Field Superintendent Wisner of the U. S. Fish Commission of Fish & Fisheries, says the Oregon City Courier. "The dam that was put in by the O. W. P. & Ry. Co. at Cazadero, kept the fish from going to the upper Clackamas station where spring samon eggs are taken. Only 100 got up to the dam, so after putting in a rack and staying there long enough to see what the result was going to be, we stopped work. In order to keep the fish that stopped by the dam from going back, we put in a rack which effectually prevented them from going down the stream. But nearly all the fish died so we got very few eggs and had to stop. The railway company had to fill up back of the dam with dirt, and this made the water muddy and salmon will not mature perfectly in muddy water. The fish were also interfered with by dumping dirt in the river just below the dam, but of course, this was necessary and the fish commission attaches no blame to the power company. Dumping dirt below the dam narrowed the river just half of its regular width making the current so strong that it was practically impossible to save the few fish that were left."
