The County's Money

County Clerk Fred W. Geenman has just completed his semi-annual financial statement of the condition of Clackamas County. The last report was made March 31, 1905, and showed a net indebtedness of \$62,362.13 This has been reduced about \$2000.00 the past six months. During the six months from September to March there is always a heavy reduction in the indebtedness, as taxes pour in during that time, but from March to October little money is received. A comparative statement of the condition of the county's finances at the present time and one year ago follows:
