

All licenses provided for in this act shall be issued as follows; ing or killing of any of the wild fowl game birds or animals protected by the laws of the State of Oregon, and which said license shall entitle the person to whom such license are issued to hunt for, pursue, take, catch or kill any of the said game animals or birds within the State of Oregon luring the open season when it is awful to kill the same.
