Lumber Yard for Estacada

Linn Brothers are going to establish and conduct a real lumber yard in Estacada. They have purchased as a site for that purpose several lots in block 36 in the southeast part of town. They will begin at once to fix up the yard, etc. This lumber firm has an extensive sawmill plant eleven miles east of town and has several hundred thousand feet of lumber ready to be hauled to town and sold. The grade of lumber that comes from this mill is the best that is found on the coast.

Will Move Their Mill

The Springwater Mill Company is intending sometime this winter to move its sawmill plant a short distance north from its present site into, a fine piece of timber said to contain upwards of 2,000,000 feet of lumber. The timber is the property of R. A. Stratton who purchased it of Will Looney. The land was not included in the transaction. The date for moving the mill has not yet been decided on. W. L. Van Dyke, manager of the mill company considers that it will take two years to clean out the lumber in their proposed new location.

Meat Hawkers to Pay

The common council passed an ordinance Tuesday evening placing a license of \$30 a quarter on meat hawkers within the city of Estacada. This does not effect farmers who sell their own product in quantities of quarters or more.
