John Goble Dead.

As a result of a fractured skull, received by a huge boulder which rolled down the bank where he was working on the dam of the O. W. P. Ry Co., at Cazadero. December 5, John Goble, of Springwater, died yesterday, Dec. 8th at 11.30 o'clock at Good Samaritan Hospital. His body was taken in charge by Coroner Finley. The latter communicated with Coroner Holman, of Clackamas County, in whose territory the accident occurred. It was decided that no inquest was necessary, and funeral arrangements are to be made later. Goble was aged 33 years.—Oregon City Enterprise.

Young Mr. Goble's home was in the Springwater country. He leaves an aged father, who is now alone in the world, to mourn his death.

Sheriff Shaver A Good Collector

Sheriff Shaver in the collection of taxes on the roll of 1904 has established a record in this county, having collected within \$5000 of the total roll which originally aggregated \$223,000. The delinquent roll that is now being prepared will not represent more than \$4,500 in unpaid taxes.—Oregon City Enterprise.
