### Will Increase to \$30,000

In speaking to a prominent member of the Estacada Wood Manufacturing Company last week the News Editor was informed that the capital stock of the company will soon be increased from \$20,000 to \$30,000 and that some large additions and improvements are to be made in the company's plant in Estacada. Among these additions will be a saw mill which will be used to furnish material for the factory. These changes are to be made just as soon as possible.

### Tax Levy Made.

County Court Fixes the Levy at 18 Mills

\$35,970 To Be Raised General County Purposes

At a meeting last week the county commissioners fixed the county tax levy for this year. Last year it was 20½ mills; this year it is 18 mills.

The estimated expenses for this year was 217,276.30 and for the last year it was \$223,061.26

The present levy was apportioned among the various funds as follows:  
 School tax.....5.1 mills  
 Co. school libraries......01 "  
 Road tax......3 "  
 Bridge......3 "  
 State......2.3 "  
 General Co. purposes.....6.3 "  
 Payment int. on county indebtedness......5 "

Last year the county raised for state purposes \$34,337.50 and this year there will be raised \$20,937.50
