Don't Fail To Register. See R. A. Stratton, Notary Public

The rules of registration are as follows: If you are not a native born citizen, you must bring your naturalization papers with you. You must have resided in the state six months preceding this election. You must have two freeholders as witnesses. Register early and avoid the rush.

March First

Shorter Road To Town

The people living on the north side of Eagle Creek northeast of Estacada, in what is familiarly called, "The German Burn" want a better and shorter road to Estacada, and a concerted effort by the people effected, assisted by all who feel public spirited, are making efforts to open up a new and better road. At present farmers coming into the town with loads must necessarily drive down the north side of Eagle Creek to the railroad to find a suitable crossing, which gives them a much longer drive to market. The idea advanced is to build a road from the north bank road south and across the creek to connect with the road that comes in from Garfield. The crossing will be established just north of the Tracy farm or some other convenient point.
