The county court, in the matter of estimating the amounts to be levied for county expenses for the current year said, at its last meeting—

It appearing that the amount due from the county under the law for state, agricultural purposes amount to \$20,937.50 That the amount required by law to be levied for general school purposes is \$5 for each of the school children of the county, which number is 8,137 and which requires the sum of \$40,685. that the law further requires the levying of a school library tax for the benefit of libraries of the several school districts which requires the sum of \$960.80; and it further appearing that it is for the best interests of the roads that at least \$28,000, shall be raised; that it will be necessary to construct several bridges, which, with the repairs to bridges and trestles it will require the sum of \$28,000, and it further appearing that it will be necessary to raise for general county purposes as shown by the following itemized list:

## The City Will Be Lighted, And Will Own Its Water System

Estacada is to be lighted by electricity. The streets are to have four arc lights. They will be put at the corners of Main and 2nd., Broadway and 2nd, on Main near 4th and on Broadway near 5th. At the meeting Tuesday evening the council voted in favor of Mr. Morris' proposition to furnish the lights at \$28 a month. It was also voted to buy the water supply system at a cost of \$7,000. Bonds will be issued for \$10,000 to buy the system and the balance will be used for extension purposes.
