C. Schuebel, deputy prosecuting attorney for this district, was in Estacada last Saturday, and looked on at the citizens' meeting. After the work of the meeting Mr. Schuebel was invited to speak to the people present on the new primary law which is so little understood. He spoke briefly but earnestly on a few features of the law, and dwelt particularly on the importance of every eligible voter registering and casting a ballot on election day. This is the first trial of the new law in Oregon, and the only way to see if it's what we want is for every man to register and vote at both nominating primaries and at the general election. Mr. Schuebel spoke to the people in Eagle Creek precinct Saturday evening on the features of the primary law.

The public meeting of last Saturday to decide on who we should support for county commissioner resulted in Mr. F. J. Harkenrider being chosen. People from Springwater, Viola, Eagle Creek, George and Estacada attended the meeting. Mr. Harkenrider is a well-known citizen of Clackamas county and has served as deputy county assessor for the east portion of the county. This, with his 23 years' residence here, has given him a knowledge of the county and its people, which makes him an ideal candidate for commissioner.

Sheriff Shaver paid his respects to the people of Estacada and vicinity last Saturday. He said that he was nicely prepared to receive taxes now. Sheriff Shaver may decide to run for another term, and if he does the other boys will have to hustle some.

Every man who expects to cast a vote at the next general election, and that should be everyone, must take some interest in the new primary election laws and get a copy of the laws. There is too many important points for one to remember from one reading.
