Last year Mrs. Heylman secured some Buff Plymouth Rock eggs of the Dalano & Johnson strain which took the first prize at the St. Louis International chicken show, and she now has a fine flock of these birds. She has nearly a hundred hens and takes a great interest in the work. She has an incubator, and last week succeeded in bringing out a hatch of 70 good, healthy chicks, all of them growing nicely. These are Buff Rocks and Rhode Island Reds, and will be raised for broilers. Mrs. Heylman intends to keep the incubator busy right along raising broilers for the market.

Voters who expect to vote at the coming primary and election should register at once. Time is rapidly slipping by and people may soon be too busy to think of this matter. If a voter doesn't register he disfranchises himself. Therefore, register. To date only 50 have registered in Estacada precinct out of a possible 250.

At a recent meeting of The Estacada Wood Manufacturing Co. Mr. O. C. Hutchins was elected manager for the company in place of C. H. Barnell. Mr. Hutchins is from Boston, and has purchased a block of stock in the company's business the capital stock of which is soon to be increased from \$20,000 to \$50,000.00

E. P. Dedman, of Clackamas, who is a candidate for the office of county recorder on the republican primary ticket, was in the city on Monday meeting the people and letting them know what his aspirations are. Mr. Dedman is a farmer living a mile and a half from Clackamas. He held the position of deputy in the recorder's office under Recorder Randall, and seems to be well qualified for the duties of the office.

Charles Smith, who superintended the building of the Estacada B. & T. Company's factory here, is in Sand Point, Idaho, where he has a contract to build one of his patent, 22 chamber brick dry kilns with the over heating system, the capacity of each chamber will be 40,000. It will be the largest brick dry kiln in the United States, and will cost about \$35,000. Mr. Smith writes that he hopes some day to build a kiln for the Estacada brick factory which he considers the finest little plant in the West.

Efforts are being put forth by a number of Clackamas county's best citizens to have a county high school established. Meetings have been held and the subject discussed, and plans laid to get the scheme under way. A committee having charge of the work has circulated petitions to voters throughout the county, and more names than the required number have already been secured. The committee intends to make a thorough canvass and then present the matter to the county court, who will then submit the question to the voters at the June election. The different associations in the county are taking an interest in the project and are working for it. The question of a location for the school is not to be considered until after the question has been settled whether or not the people want it but Estacada being so near the geographical center of the county, it is the logical conclusion that it will be located here.
