Ben Rawlins, a prominent rancher from over beyond Linn's sawmill was in the city, Monday.

Iva and Ruth Dale and Linda May Womer have been granted certificates to teach school.

Miss Iva Dale has been employed by the Garfield school board to complete Prof. Stubbs' unexpired term.

The Bank of Estacada is now prepared to receive Clackamas county taxes, the same as the sheriff, and receipt for same.

John T. Page has handed his resignation as treasurer of Estacada to the council to take effect as soon as a successor is appointed and qualified.

Ed. Wonacott, who has bought the Cliff Sarver place near Garfield, was in town, Wednesday. Ed. and the News editor used to camp on the same grounds down South.

The city council transacted business Tuesday evening. A few bills were allowed, and the ordinance granting Mr. Morris the privilege to light the town, and the ordinance on the water system were signed.

The city school board has accepted Prof. Surface's resignation as principal of the city schools, and on Wednesday Mr. Surface retired from the schools, and Prof. J. E. Stubbs, who has been teaching at Garfield, took up the work, and he will complete the term.

Contractor Lindsey has drawn plans for the Estacada State Bank building at the corner of Broadway and Second Sts. The front 34 feet of this building will be used by the bank. It will have two rooms, and a cement and brick vault will be built. The front that is in the building now will be taken out and put in the side to the rear, and the front will be remodeled with plate glasses. Cement walks will be put down.

Elvin Morrow entertained a number of his friends Monday evening, Feb. 26, it being his 13th birthday. The evening was spent in playing games, and a birthday luncheon was served. FREE RURAL ROUTE STARTS

Route No. 1, Out of Estacada With W. S. Irwin As Carrier

Postmaster Haviland has received instructions from the postoffice department that the new free rural mail delivery route which will run from Estacada through the Currinsville and Garfield countries will start today, March 1st, with W. S. Irwin as carrier. Mr. Irwin was the only applicant before the civil service examination for the job and he will hold it as long as he is qualified or until he relinquishes it, at a salary of \$720 and other perquisites. The department also informs Mr. Haviland that both the post-offices at Currinsville and Garfield will be discontinued on and after March 15, as the new route will make these offices unnecessary. Those who are having their mail come to either of the above offices should give notice to have their mail sent to Estacada R. F. D. 1, and have it delivered to the door. The carrier will leave Estacada at 9:30 a. m. and return at 5 p. m. The route as established will begin at the postoffice in Estacada, thence East and North to Tracy's corner 3/4 miles; West 1/2 mile; North to Git-en's corner 2 1/2 miles; Southeast to Marsha's corner 3 miles; South and Southeast to Novotne's corner 1 3/4 miles; East to Palmateer's corner 5/8 miles; Southeast and East to Porter's corner 3/4 miles; South to the School house 1/2 miles; East and Southeast to Kreiger's 1 1/2 miles; West to Lockerby's corner 2 1/4 miles; North 1/4, and West 1 3/4, to Davis' 1 3/8 miles; North to Outfield's 1 1/2 miles; West 5/8, and North 1/2 to Wagner's 3/8 miles; West 3/8, and North 5/8 to Yocum's corner 1 mile; West to John Tracy's corner 1 1/2 miles; South and West to the Post Office 3/4 mile. Total length of route 24 1/4 miles. Area, square miles 20 1/4. Number of houses 110. Population served 495.
