Senator Geo. C. Brownell and Others Hold an Enthusiastic Meeting at Eagle Creek

The people of Eagle Creek and
vicinity were entertained last Sat-
urday evening by a number of the
republican candidates for county
and legislative offices. The meet-
ing was held in the Grange hall and
was presided over by Dr. C. B.
Smith. The hall was well filled,
and a number of Estacada people
attended, being taken down and
back in a special car. The Mil-
waukie male quartette was present
and sung a number of campaign
songs and melodies, which were
greatly enjoyed by the hearers.
Senator Brownell was the principal
speaker and spoke for an hour on
the features of the campaign which
should decide the voter's choice at
the April primary. He dwelt at
length on his own political record,
and gave the people an idea of the
most important legislation he would
work for should he be re-elected.
Publisher Porter, Editor Eastham
and the Enterprise were given a few
bouquets. By reference to the Sena-
te journal, Mr. Brownell showed
how he had worked and voted on
the leading issues of the last session
of the state legislature. He took
up the indictment issue and showed
how absolutely false the charge was
and how his political enemies had

T. J. Andre Meets His Death

T. J. Andre was killed Monday
night when on the railroad a half
mile south of Barton. He was run
into by the motor engine. He was
not seen till it was too late to stop
the car. He was struck on the hip
and received other injuries on head
and limbs. The body remained on
the spot until Coroner Holeman re-
moved it next day to Oregon City
where burial took place yesterday.
Andre was returning from Portland
and got off at Barton to get a drink
and was left there. Later in the
evening, he started to walk to Es-
tacada with the fatal result. He
was intoxicated, and when seen by
the motorman appeared to be crawl-
ing off the track. His son, Dale, a
daughter, and a widow survive him.
