A Letter From Frisco

B. O. Boswell has received a letter from an old friend in Oakland, manager of the General Electric Co. there. Among other things, the letter says:

"We are all right, and everybody connected with both the office and the family is safe. Those of us on the Oakland side of the Bay suffered only temporary inconvenience and damage while some of them on the other side burned out and have only what they had on. Many of the people who lived in San Francisco who were connected with our office were outside of the burned district. We have opened new offices in Oakland and are doing business just the same. You have, of course, seen in the papers how the city was destroyed, practically not a building on Market St. stands except the Call building and a new building across the street, and the entire lower part of the city is destroyed. By the time you get this there will be a trolley car line on Market St. and new buildings will be in course of construction. While the destruction has been awful, the re-construction will be wonderfully rapid and we shall soon be on our feet again."

The O. W. P. Sale

Few changes will result from the sale of the O. W. P. & Ry. Co. to the Clarke & Seligman interests. At a meeting of the local officers on Monday W. H. Hurlburt, was elected general manager of the railway department. Mr. Hurlburt has resigned from the O. W. P., as did also Fred S. Morris, its old treasurer. The new officials chosen are: President, H. W. Good, president of the Portland General Electric Company; Vice-President F. I. Fuller, president of the Portland Railway Company; Secretary and Treasurer, C. N. Huggins, treasurer of the Portland Railway company; General Counsel, O. F. Paxton. The same officers, together with S. G. Reed, treasurer of the Portland General, complete the board of directors.

G. I. Brown, chief engineer of the O W P, has resigned and gone east in order to supervise work Morris Bros. have under way there. He has been in charge of the building of the dam and immense power plant near Estacada, and his services there have been commented on in a most complimentary manner. It was given out after the meeting that the business of the company would be conducted as heretofore and on the same general lines, no changes being contemplated in connection with employes or the system. The work that has been started will be completed as planned and later more extensions may be authorized.

While the the Portland Railway company and the O W P have not been merged, the two systems will be operated in harmony together with the Portland General, as is evidenced by the fact that the board of directors is composed of similar officers from the two companies.
