## CLACKAMAS COUNTY ELECTION

The unofficial returns of all the precincts in the county but two give Hedges 548 majority over Mr. Brownell. They also give Latourette for clerk 1980, and Greenman 2030; Beatie for sheriff 2032, and Maddock 1991. The official count is expected to put Latourette and Beatie in. The county's vote in all but the two precincts follows:

## ELECTION DAY

### A MIXTURE

The Day A Very Quiet One In Estacada, With Only One Personal Qurrel

Election day has passed and the suspense with which some have been worrying has ended—worse, perhaps, than had been expected. The day was pleasant enough, and indications were for a heavy vote, but a large number of the voters remained away from the polls. Out of a count by the party organizations placing the number of voters in Estacada precinct at 226 there were but 169 ballots cast. A fourth of the people remained at home, to work, or for some other reason. It is reasonable to suppose, however, that had a full vote been cast the main result would have been practically the same.

The vote on the equal suffrage amendment was 72 in favor and 72 opposed.  
The local option amendment was voted against 98 to 38.  
The Barlow road proposition was rejected 96 to 45.  
County High school lost 92 to 42  
All other amendments were carried by large majorities.
