Salmon Rack

Some weeks ago the Government Bureau of Fisheries gave the contract to W. W. Smith and Charles Roadarmel to instal in the Clackamas river at Cazadero a rack that is designed to prevent the Fall run of salmon from reaching the Oregon Water Power company's dam at that place, so that the salmon can be taken for propagation purposes. The racks are now completed are the most substantial ever before put in the Clackamas river.
