Case Decided in Favor of Dubois

The sawdust case against Charley Dubois which was tried last week before Justice Stipp at Oregon City was decided by the jury in favor of Mr. Dubois, and Charley came home with his tail feathers up and flying. Everybody seems to be pleased at the outcome of the case, because it is not thought that there has been any overt act committed. The jurymen visited and examined the little brook into which sawdust is alleged to have been dumped and then carried into the Clackamas river, and after all the evidence and arguments had been listened to they returned a verdict in favor of Mr. Dubois. Several from here went over and gave testimony in the trial and the case will cost about \$150. Deputy Game Warden C. Scheibel prosecuted the case, and George C. Brownell defended Mr. Dubois.
