Street Contract Let
 The city aldermen met on last Thursday evening to consider bids to macadamize Broadway south of Third street. But one proposition was presented to the board, that of Contractor Al Lindsey. His bid was for \$4,725, and the board accepted it and awarded Mr. Lindsey the work. There is about 570 feet of street 80 feet wide to be fixed up and it comes a little high, but the street must be improved and this appears to the property owners to be the best method. Those who will be affected mostly by the proposed street improvement are the townsite company, the railway company and Mayor J. W. Reed. The work will be begun as soon as the sewer is completed.
