Potatoe Crop Rottening

It is estimated that fully 500 acres of potatoes remain in the ground in Eastern Multnomah County at this time, and the probabilities are that they will be almost a total loss. The scarcity of labor during the month of October and the heavy rains of the present month are responsible for the seeming negligence of the farmers. It only needs a severe cold spell to complete the threatened loss. Even if the rains should cease and the days should be dry and clear the loss will be heavy, as many of the potatoes are beginning to rot and the ground is so wet and heavy that the cost of digging will be greater than usual. The loss of the crop yet in the ground would mean a loss of fully \$50,000 to this section alone, and it is probable that other parts of the state will suffer similar loss especially that portion along the western slope of the Cascades.

Was Nearly Killed

Arthur Ulich came near meeting instant death Tuesday. He was at work at O. A. Palmer's logging camp just above Estacada at the time and was standing close to a wire cable when it broke and the ironed end hit him on the back of the head. He was brought into town and Dr. Smith administered to his wound, and later he was taken to a Portland hospital. Mr. Ulich's condition was quite serious. His skull was badly fractured and a piece of bone was removed from the brain. He is a young man whose home is at Boring.
