### Receipts Increase In County Offices

The financial reports of the various county officials for November compare more than favorably with last month's and also with last year reports at the same time.

The sheriff's office shows a most gratifying condition in connection with the delinquent tax list. November 1, the list totaled \$3888.02 as compared with \$4130.01 for Dec. 1 of last year. It was predicted a month ago that the amount would probably be reduced to \$3500. before the time for publication arrived. At present the list has already lowered to about \$3300 more than \$800 less than last year.

The county clerk's office for November shows receipts in fees of \$665, as compared with \$775 for last November. The decrease incotuas cmfwy by the fact that Judge McBride held court in October which diverted a considerable amount into the October funds that would naturally have gone into November. Taking the two months and comparing with last year the report shows \$1221.75 for this year October and November, and \$1154.50 for last year.

A steady advance is noticeable in the county clerk's office for the last five or six years. For November the figures are as follows: 1902 \$282 1903, \$565; 1904, \$643; 1905, \$775; 1906, \$665.

The recorder's report gives the receipts for last month of 1905 and 1906 to be \$248.65 and \$326.05 respectively.—Oregon City Enterprise
