WRECK ON INTER URBAN.

Tacoma-Seattle Passenger and Work Trains Meet on Curve.

Tacoma, Wash., Dec. 27. - Interur-Tacoma, and a work train consisting of a motor and fixe flatcars, collided head on in a cut about a mile east of Milton and 14 more or less badly hurt. The first coach of the interurban passenger was telescoped, and two of the flatears

There were about 20 passengers in the telescoped smoker, some of whom strangely escaped with only slight injuries. The car was entirely demol-ished, and some of the passengers were

hurled 20 feet in the flying wreckage.

Train No. 3 from Seattle was late and had orders to sidetrack at Edgewood to let No. 6, the passenger for on the work train, was sent to Edge-
