County Tax Asssment And Levy

The county court has decided on an 18 mills tax levy for the next year. It is estimated that this will raise \$189,000 which is thought to be the amount to pay the county's running expenses. The amount is divided as follows:

Load and highways.....	\$42,000
County schools.....	49,875
County expenses.....	35,000
State school purposes.....	34,125
School library.....	875
Interest on outstanding war rants.....	4,325
Redemption of outstanding warrants.....	22,700
Total.....	\$189,000

The Council Transacts Business

A quorum of the city council met with the mayor and recorder Tuesday evening. A number of bills was allowed and ordered paid. An order was placed for 200 booklets of the Rules and Regulations, and Schedule of Water Rates of the Estacada water system. Joseph Nicholson was appointed Superintendent of the water system, and Street Commissioner, at a salary of \$50 a month, upon execution of a bond to the city of \$250. A water board was appointed consisting of Councilmen Cary, Stratton and Miller. The clerk of the board was instructed to find out what 3,000 feet of 4 inch wood water pipe will cost. It is the intention of the council to extend a water main from Second St. near Boulevard Avenue north to the school house. Some discussion followed about moving the building used by the fire department over onto the lot belonging to the city, and enlarging it. John Cassidy appeared before the council as a committee from the fire department and asked the council to provide a place for the fire boys to meet.
