August Genserowski

August Genserowski was born in Berlin, Germany, in 1850, and died in Portland, Oregon, on Saturday, January 5, 1907. He came to America at the age of 30, and settled at Springwater 13 years ago. Last Friday he went to Portland to consult a specialist in regard to an affliction of the stomach, and on Saturday while undergoing an operation, he suddenly died. The body was brought back home Tuesday, and funeral services conducted by Rev. C. T. McPherson at Springwater church. Mr. Genserowski was a citizen well thought of and highly respected by his neighbors. He was a member of the Lutheran church, and a trustee of the Springwater school. A wife and five children survive him.
