Farmers' Institute At Estacada

Farmers and Other Citizens
Meet and Listen to Instructive Lectures

The farmers' institute, or improvement meeting, convened in Fraternity Hall at 1:30 Monday afternoon with only a fair attendance of practical farmers. The following gentlemen from the state agricultural college, and other parts of the state were present and took an active part in the discussions both in the afternoon and evening sessions—Dr. James Withycomb, J. H. Reed, Wm. Schulmarich, M. S. Shock, Ed. Judd, A. J. Lewis, C. R. Gleason, Ike Mellan and C. E. Bradley.

The talks by these gentlemen were along the lines that benefit the farmer, and help him to make the most money in his occupation, and at the same time, little suggestions were given to help the tiller of the soil over the troubles and obstacles that beset his path. The country and farming generally was handled by Dr. Withycomb. Dairying and the dairy cow was intelligently talked on by Mr. Reid. Fruit pests and the treatment necessary to get rid of them was an other interesting subject. Not very many farmers remained for the evening, but the hall room was well filled with people who enjoyed every thing that was said.

A very great amount of good will result from these meetings being held in Clackamas County, especially to those localities that have a big per cent of new residents who are looking for information on farming in this country.

Had to Go

Over at Woodburn the Southern Pacific Company fired ten Americans of its section hands and hired Japs. Have Good Copper Properties South

The owners of the mine are confident that they have a big thing in sight, and will investigate the extent of the mine.—Oregon City Star.
