Big Electric Power Plant Formally Star ted

The large electric power plant at Cazadero which is to furnish electric power to run Estacada's various manufacturing industries was formally put in operation, Tuesday, although the plant had been running at its normal capacity for several days previous. The beginning of this great enterprise was celebrated by the company and 225 invited guests. The Portland Railway, Light & Power Co. ran five special cars out from Portland all filled with prominent business men, city and state officers, to view the new plant and witness its opening. The crowd was taken over the whole works. After viewing the construction of the dam, flume and reservoir, the big crowd gathered at the power house to see the starting of the wonderful machinery. At a given signal Mayor Lane of Portland turned the wheel which put in motion the electricity manufacturing plant. After a brief stay here the cars were run to Estacada, where a banquet was held at the Hotel Estacada in the evening. The hotel was very beautifully decorated, with hundreds of large and miniature incandescent lights, evergreens, flags etc. The banquet was a sumptuous affair. A number of short addresses were delivered by President H. W. Goode of the company, Mayor Lane, Dan Malarkey and others. Quite a number of Estacada people were guests at the celebration. The new power plant will continue to run night and day, and the electricity will be used in Portland and on the line.

The cost of this electric power plant has been over \$1,000,000 and it has taken nearly four years to build it. It is capable of generating 15,000 horse power, and with a trifle more expense at the generating plant 25,000 horse can be developed.

The construction of the plant has been in charge of F. G. Sykes, general manager of the light department, and the work has been done in a skillful manner.

The dam was built under the direction of T. W. Sullivan, hydraulic engineer for the company, as was also the reservoir and connection.

O. B. Goldwell, operating engineer, has had charge of the electrical construction of the plant.
